

Student Guide – Getting Ready for High School Programs In Person Delivery



Program Description

This program is open to all students entering grade 9 in a Durham District School Board school in September and provides them with a brief introduction to the grade 9 English and mathematics curriculum, as well as study skills, time management, and steps to success. The program also allows students to become familiar with their new school and prepares them for the transition from elementary school to secondary school. It is especially helpful for students who are experiencing some anxiety related to the upcoming transition. Each daily program will be taught by an OCT qualified teacher. **Students will be engaged in activities from 8:30 AM – 1:30 PM daily.** Time will be allotted for refreshment and nourishment. Students are encouraged to bring water, snacks/lunch, and their Chromebooks (where applicable).

At registration, students will be registered in the program at the secondary school in which they will be attending in Fall 2022. Regular attendance is suggested to allow students to benefit from this program. Students should be available for activities from 8:30 AM to 1:30 PM for the duration of the program.
